I ka wā kahiko, he mau ‘ano ānuenue i ‘ike ‘ia, a he mau hō‘ailona ‘ano nui ia mau ‘ano ānuenue no ka po‘e Hawai‘i o kēia pae ‘āina nei. Ua unuhi ‘ia nā hō‘ailona e nā kāhuna kilokilo, nā kāula, a me nā maka‘āinana kekahi. ‘O nā pahuhopu o kēia papahana nei, ‘o ia ka wehewehe ‘ana i nā hi‘ohi‘ona ānuenue, nā pō‘ai lewa a me nā manawa o nā ‘ano ānuenue e ‘ō‘ili ai, ko lākou mau hō‘ailona/‘ōuli, a me ka ho‘ohālikelike ‘ana i ka ‘ike Hawai‘i ku‘una me ka ‘ike ‘epékema komohana e pili ana i ke ānuenue. Ua noi‘i ‘ia nā nūpepa ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i kahiko, nā mo‘olelo Hawai‘i ku‘una, nā puke a nā mea ‘imi na‘auao Hawai‘i kaulana, nā lola o kekahi mau nīnauele o kauwahi kūpuna i hala, a me kauwahi nīnaulele o kekahi mau kumu e ola ana i kēia au. Ua noi‘i ‘ia nō ho‘i nā ‘ike ‘epékema komohana e pili ana i ke kupu ‘ana i ke ānuenue. Ua ho‘ākāka ‘ia nā hopena noi‘i no nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole. Ua hō‘oia ‘ia kanakolu ‘ano ānuenue, a me iwakāluakūmākahi hō‘ailona. Ua hohonu loa nō ka ‘ike Hawai‘i ku‘una e pili ana i nā hō‘ailona ānuenue a me nā ‘ano ānuenue a pau. Ua hohonu loa nō ka ‘ike ‘epékema komohana e pili ana i ke kālaikūlohea ānuenue. Waiwai nō ka ‘ike o ka lāhui Hawai‘i a me ka lāhui ‘epékema. Hiki ke ho‘opuka ‘ia ka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i no ka wehewehe ‘ana i ia mau kuana‘ike he ‘elua.

Abstract

In the past, different types of rainbows were known, and they were signs for the Hawaiian people of this archipelago. They were interpreted by the priests, prophets, and the commoners alike. The goals of this project are to explain the rainbow features, the vertical strata and the times that the types of rainbows appear, their signs/omens, and to compare the traditional Hawaiian knowledge to the western scientific knowledge concerning rainbows. The research sources include the old Hawaiian language newspapers, traditional Hawaiian stories, books of

famous Hawaiian scholars, recordings of interviews of elders that have passed, and interviews of some people that are living today. Western scientific sources were also researched concerning rainbows. The research results are explained for all of the rainbow types. Thirty types of rainbows were identified along with twenty one signs/omens. The traditional Hawaiian knowledge about signs/omens and types of rainbows is very deep. The western scientific knowledge about rainbow physics is very deep. The knowledge of the Hawaiian people and the scientists are both very valuable. The Hawaiian language can be used to explain both perspectives.

Ku‘i ka hekili, ua ka ua, kaiko‘o ka moana, ‘ōlapa ka uila, uhi ka noe, pi‘o ke ānuenue, kū ka pūnihu i ka moana. ‘O ia kekahī mau hō‘ailona kupaiānaha e kupu pinepine i ke ao kūlōhelohe i nā manawa o kekahī mau hanana ‘ano nui, ke kū ‘ana mai o kekahī ali‘i/akua, ka nohona o kekahī ‘e‘epa, a pēlā aku. E ku‘u mea heluhelu, i ka wā ma mua, he mea ‘ano nui ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i ia mau hō‘ailona Hawai‘i. Eia na‘e, e koli‘i a‘e ana nō ia ‘ike Hawai‘i ku‘una i ka noe o ka wā i hala ma muli o ka hana ‘ino a nā po‘e kolonaio a me ko kākou kaila nohona o kēia au ‘enehana. Pa‘ahana kākou i kā kākou mau ‘oihana, a no laila, aia ka pono ‘o ka mālama ‘ana i ka ‘ike Hawai‘i ku‘una o nā kūpuna.

I ka wā kahiko, he mau ‘ano ānuenue i ‘ike ‘ia, a he mau hō‘ailona ‘ano nui ia mau ‘ano ānuenue no ka po‘e Hawai‘i o kēia pae ‘āina nei. Ua unuhi ‘ia e nā kāhuna kilokilo, nā kāula, a me nā maka‘āinana kekahī. Nui ‘ino nā hō‘ailona o ke ānuenue, eia na‘e, kauka‘i ka hō‘ailona ma ka unuhi o ka mea nānā. ‘O ia ho‘i, he mau hō‘ailona ko ke ānuenue. Hiki ke nānā ‘ia ho‘okahi ānuenue e ‘elua mea nānā, a no kekahī mea, he hō‘ailona pōmaika‘i ia ānuenue, a no ka mea ‘ē a‘e, he hō‘ailona ‘ino ia ānuenue.¹ Eia kekahī, ‘a‘ole i like loa ka ‘ike a me ka unuhi ‘ana a nā kāhuna e pili ana i ke ānuenue. Eia nō na‘e, ma kēia pae ‘āina nei, ua hānai ‘ia ka hapa nui loa o kākou³ ma loko o ka ho‘ohuli mana‘o ikaika o ka mo‘omeheu komohana o ka haole. I kēia manawa ‘enehana nei o kākou e noho ana, ka‘aluna nō ka ‘ike haole. ‘A‘ole hiki iā kākou ke hō‘alo i ke kuana‘ike haole i pa‘a nei iā kākou. No laila, he ‘ano nui nō ho‘i paha ka hō‘ike ‘ana i ke kuana‘ike haole e pili ana i ke ānuenu.

‘O ia mau kuana‘ike he ‘elua, ‘o ia ka pō‘aiapili o ka mana‘o i loko o ko kākou na‘au e ‘ike ‘ia ai ke ‘ano o ia mea he ānuenu. No laila, kilo ‘ia ke kuana‘ike Hawai‘i ku‘una a me ke kuana‘ike haole e pili ana i ke ao kūlohelohelohe a me ke ānuenu ma loko o ka Mokuna 2 o kēia pepa nei. ‘O kekahi pō‘aiapili ‘ano nui ‘ē a‘e no ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i ke ānuenu, ‘o ia ka pō‘aiapili lewa, ‘oiai, ‘ō‘ili ke ānuenu ma ka lewa. No laila, wehewehe ‘ia nā pō‘ai lewa a me nā pō‘ai Kahiki o ka lā ma loko o ka Mokuna 4 o lalo iho.

He aha ka waiwai o kēia noi‘i? Koli‘i aku nō ka ‘ike Hawai‘i a me ka ho‘ohana ‘ana i kekahi hua‘ōlelo Hawai‘i ku‘una, e la‘a nā inoa o nā ‘ano ānuenu. Mālama ‘ia paha ia mau inoa ma o kēia noi‘i, a mana‘olana, e ho‘ohana ‘ia nā hua‘ōlelo ānuenu i nā manawa o kahi ‘ano ānuenu e ‘ō‘ili ai i ka lewa. Hō‘ike ‘ia nō ke akamai o nā kūpuna, a hō‘ike ‘ia nō ho‘i ē hiki ke kū pū ka ‘ike Hawai‘i ku‘una me ka ‘ike ‘epukema. E hō‘ike ‘ia nō ho‘i ē hiki ke ho‘ohana ‘ia ka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i no ka wehewehe ‘ana i ka ‘ike Hawai‘i ku‘una a me ka ‘ike ‘epukema o kēia au

hou kekahi. No laila, e hō‘eleu ‘ia paha ka na‘au o nā ‘ōpio i ka mālama ‘ana i ka ‘ike Hawai‘i ku‘una, a me ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i ka ‘ike ‘eprekema ma o ka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i.

He mana‘o e pili ana i ka noi‘i e hō‘ike ‘ia ana ma loko o kēia pepa nui, lehulehu nā kūmole i noi‘i ‘ia, eia na‘e, aia nō paha kekahi mau ‘ike ānuenue Hawai‘i ku‘una i loa‘a ‘ole i kēia papahana. ‘O ia ho‘i, ‘oko‘a paha ka ‘ike ānuenue o kekahi mokupuni, ‘oko‘a paha ka ‘ike ānuenue o kekahi mokupuni. Eia kekahi, ma loko o ho‘okahi mokupuni, ‘o ia ‘oko‘a nō ke ‘ike ‘ia ma waena o nā moku. He la‘ana, ma ka moku ‘o Kaupō, Maui, ua ‘ike ‘ia kekahi ‘ano ānuenue pōkole a poepoe i kapa ‘ia ‘o Pōpōua ka inoa. ‘Ike ‘ia ia ānuenue i nā kakahiaka a pau ma luna o ka pu‘u ‘o ‘Ō‘ilipu‘u ma Haleakalā. Ma waho o Kaupō, he inoa ua ‘o Pōpōua,⁴ a ma loko nō ho‘i o nā puke wehewehe, ‘o ia mau nō kona ‘ano he inoa ua. Eia hou kekahi, ‘a‘ole i pa‘i ‘ia ka ‘ike Hawai‘i ku‘una a pau ma loko o nā nūpepa, a ‘a‘ole nō ho‘i paha i hō‘ike ‘ia ia ‘ike ma waho a‘e o kekahi mau ‘ohana. No laila, inā ‘a‘ole paha i ‘ōkomo ‘ia kekahi ‘ike ānuenue ku‘una ma loko o kēia pepa nui, i hewa nō ho‘i i ka mea kākau.

Eia hou kekahi, i mea e wehewehe ai i nā kumuhanā laulā a puni ka ‘ō‘ili ‘ana o nā ‘ano ānuenue, ho‘ohāiki ‘ia ka hō‘ike ‘ana o kekahi o ia mau kumuhanā ma loko o kēia pepa. Lehulehu nō nā mana‘o like ‘ole i hō‘ike ‘ole ‘ia e pili ana i ia mau kumuhanā. ‘O ia ho‘i, ‘a‘ohe pau ka ‘ike i ka hālau ho‘okahi.⁵ No laila, ‘o ka ‘ikepili ma loko o kekahi o nā māhele o kēia pepa, ‘a‘ole ia he mea ho‘okahi, akā he manamana nō.

1.1 He Mau Wae ‘Ana

1.1.1 He Mau Koho Kākau ‘Ana

I ke kākau ‘ana i kēia pepa nui laeo‘o nei, ua koho ‘ia kekahi mau mea kaila. Eia nā kumu no ia mau mea ma lalo iho nei:

1. Ka leo kino mua. ‘Oiai, he pepa noi‘i kēia, ‘a‘ole i kākau ‘ia i ka leo kino mua, koe ka māhele 1.2, ‘o ia ka mole o kēia papahana. Ma loko o ia māhele, makemake ka mea kākau e ho‘ākāka i nā mea nāna i ho‘okīpaipai pono‘ī i kēia papahana.
2. Ke kaha ‘ana i ka ‘okina a me ke kahakō. ‘Oko‘a ka mana‘o o nā polopeka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i e pili ana i ke kaha ‘ana i nā ‘atikala nūpepa ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i. No kēia pepa nui nei, hō‘ike ‘ia nā inoa a me nā puana‘ī o nā kūmole like ‘ole i ke ‘ano o lākou i pa‘i ‘ia ai. He la‘ana: ua pa‘i mua ‘ia Ka Moolelo o Laieikawai i ka nūpepa ‘o Ka Hoku o ka Pakipika i ka makahiki 1862 i kaha ‘ole ‘ia i ke kahakō a me ka ‘okina. Eia na‘e, ua pa‘i ‘ia Ke Ka‘ao o Lā‘ieikawai e ka Hale Kuamo‘o i ka makahiki 2001 i kaha ‘ia i ke kahakō a me ka ‘okina. Ua nānā ‘ia Ke Ka‘ao o Lā‘ieikawai no kēia pepa nui. No laila, hō‘ike ‘ia kona inoa a me nā puana‘ī o ia ka‘ao nona nā kaha.
3. Ka unuhi ‘ana. He kūmole ‘ano nui nō nā puke wehewehe no kēia papahana. Ua pa‘i ‘ia i ka ‘ōlelo haole. Eia na‘e, he makemake nui o ka mea kākau, ‘o ia ka hana ‘ana a me ke kākau ‘ana i ka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i wale. No laila, unuhi ‘ia nā weheweheha o nā ‘ano ānuenue i ka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i no kēia papahana laeo‘o. Eia kekahi, ma loko o nā puke wehewehe, aia kekahi mau la‘ana ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i a me

nā wehewehena ‘ōlelo haole. He la‘ana ka hua‘ōlelo ‘ālewalewa. Eia ka wehewehena ‘ōlelo haole:

Pukui/Elbert: vs. Buoyant, floating.

Andrews: s. A cloud or smoke floating in the atmosphere; hookaa ka punohu ka alewalewa.

Eia ka wehewehena i unuhi ‘ia i ka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i:

Pukui/Elbert: vs. lana, ‘ālana.

Andrews: s. He ao a i ‘ole he uahi e lana ana i ka lewa; hookaa ka punohu ka alewalewa.

Ua unuhi ‘ia nā hua‘ōlelo haole, a mālama ‘ia nā hua‘ōlelo Hawai‘i, penei:

hookaa ka punohu ka alewalewa.

4. Nā koho ki‘i. Hō‘ike ‘ia kekahi mau ki‘i no nā ‘ano ānuenue a pau ma loko o kēia pepa nui. Ua koho ‘ia nā ki‘i ma muli o kekahi no‘ono‘o maiau ‘ana i nā kūmole like ‘ole. ‘A‘ole i kūlike nā kūmole a pau e pili ana i nā hi‘ohi‘ona o kekahi mau ‘ano ānuenue. No laila, he mau ki‘i no kekahi mau ‘ano ānuenue.
5. Ka hō‘ike makemakika. Nui ‘ino nā ‘ikepili hō‘ailona i ‘ohi ‘ia no kēia papahana. Kama‘āina ka mea kākau i kekahi mau hō‘ike makemakika e ho‘ohana pinepine ‘ia no ke kālailai ‘ana i ‘ikepili. Ua koho ‘ia ka hō‘ike ha‘ihelu ho‘oili i mea e ho‘omaopopo ai i ke kupu ‘ana o nā hō‘ailona like ‘ole e pili ana kekahi i kekahi. He hō‘ike nōhie paha ia, a ho‘ākāka ‘ia i loko o ka Pāku‘ina 1, a ma loko o nā māhele like ‘ole e pili ana i nā ‘ano ānuenue.
6. Ka pela hua‘ōlelo ‘ana. Ua ho‘okūlike ‘ia ka pela hua‘ōlelo ‘ana e ka ‘ahahui ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i o ka makahiki 1978.⁶ Ua maopopo i ka mea kākau, ‘a‘ole paha ‘aelike ka mana‘o o nā kumu ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i like ‘ole i nā mea a pau ma loko o ia

palapala. He la‘ana: ma loko o nā nūpepa kahiko, ua kākau ‘ia ka hua‘ōlelo “apau” a i ‘ole “a pau”. Ua ho‘oholo ‘ia e ia ‘ahahui ē ‘o ka “a pau” ka pela ‘ana e ho‘ohana ‘ia. No laila, ‘o ia ka pela ‘ana i ho‘ohana ‘ia no kēia pepa nui nei.

1.1.2 He Mau Wae Hua‘ōlelo ‘Ana

I mea e hō‘ike ai i ke ‘ano o nā ānuenue like ‘ole a me ko lākou hi‘ohi‘ona, ‘o ka mea i pono ai ka wae ‘ana i kekahi hua‘ōlelo kūpono. ‘O ka mea mua, he aha ka hua‘ōlelo kūpono loa? ‘O ia ke ‘ano ānuenue a i ‘ole ka *inoa ānuenue*? Malia paha, like a like ia mau hua‘ōlelo ānuenue. No laila, ua noi‘i ‘ia ka papakilo waihona no ka ho‘ohana ‘ia ‘ana o ia mau hua‘ōlelo. Eia kā, ‘o ka hapa nui loa, ho‘opuka ‘ia ke ‘ano ānuenue (ma loko o 58 ‘atikala), a ‘o ka hapa iki, ho‘opuka ‘ia o ka *inoa ānuenue* (ma loko o 6 ‘atikala).⁷ Aia kekahi mau la‘ana o ka ho‘opuka ‘ia ‘ana o ke ‘ano ānuenue ma loko o kahi mo‘olelo, ‘o ia ka mo‘olelo o Kihapiilani, penei: “... aia ka hoike mai la i na wai hooluu like ole o na hiona ano anuenue e pipio pono ana ma luna o ke alii.”⁸ Eia kekahi, ma loko o kekahi ‘atikala a Nawahi, ua ho‘opuka ‘ia ke ‘ano ānuenue no ka wehewehe ‘ana i nā ānuenue ‘o Luakālai, ‘o Luahoano, a me kekahi ‘ano ‘ē a‘e.⁹ No laila, no kēia papahana nei, ho‘ohana ‘ia ke ‘ano ānuenue no ka wehewehe ‘ana i nā ānuenue like ‘ole.

‘O ka mea a‘e e pono ai, ‘o ia ka wae ‘ana i kekahi mau hua‘ōlelo no ka wehewehe ‘ana i ka unuhi ‘ia ‘ana o nā ānuenue e nā mea nānā. ‘O hō‘ailona ka hua‘ōlelo e ho‘opuka pinepine ‘ia, a kohu like paha me ka hua‘ōlelo ‘o ‘ōuli. I kekahi manawa, ho‘opuka ‘ia kekahi *wānana* ma muli o kahi ‘ōuli. ‘O kekahi mau koho hua‘ōlelo ‘ē a‘e no ka unuhi ‘ana i ka ‘ō‘ili ‘ana o ke ānuenue, ‘o ia ka *māpumana* ‘o a i ‘ole ke *kaona*. He hua‘ōlelo hou ka māpumana‘o, a ‘a‘ole i ho‘opuka ‘ia e pili ana i ke ānuenue ma loko o nā kūmole ku‘una. ‘O ke *kaona*, kūpono paha ia,

a he kaona paha ko nā ānuenue like ‘ole ma loko o kekahi mau mele. Eia na‘e, ‘a‘ole i ho‘opuka ‘ia i ka pō‘aiapili o ke ānuenue ma loko o nā kūmole ku‘una. No laila, no kēia papahana, e ho‘opuka wale ‘ia nō nā hua‘ōlelo ‘o ka *hō‘ailona*, ka ‘ōuli, a me ka *wānana* e pili ana i ka unuhi ‘ana i ka ‘ō‘ili ‘ana o nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole.

I ka wā i hala, he mau māhele ko ke lani. He aha ka hua‘ōlelo kūpono loa no ka wehewehe ‘ana i ia mau māhele? He ‘ekolu koho paha, ‘o ia ka *māhele*, ke *kā‘ei* a i ‘ole ka *pō‘ai*. Ua ho‘opuka ‘o Malo lāua ‘o Kamakau i ka *pō‘ai*.¹⁰ No laila, ‘o ia ka hua‘ōlelo e ho‘opuka ‘ia no kēia papahana.

1.2 Ka Mole o Kēia Papahana

‘O ke oli ‘o He Mele No Kāne ka mea i ho‘oulu i ka hoihoi ma loko o‘u i ke ānuenue, a ‘o ia ka mole o kēia noi‘i. Ma loko o ka paukū ‘ehā, oli ‘ia he mau ‘ano ānuenue, ‘o ia ho‘i, ke ānuenue, ka pūnohu, ka uakoko, a me ka ‘ālewalewa penei:

“E ui aku ana au iā ‘oe,
Aia i hea ka wai a Kāne?
 Aia i kai, i ka moana,
I ke kualau, i ke ānuenue,
I ka **pūnohu**, i ka **uakoko**,
 I ka ‘ālewalewa;
Aia i laila ka wai a Kāne.”¹¹

Ma muli o ia oli, ho‘oulu ‘ia a‘e ka‘u nīele, a ua hāpai ‘ia nō ho‘i kekahi mau nīnau e pili ana i nā ‘ano ānuenue ma loko o‘u. ‘Ehia ‘ano ānuenue i ‘ike ‘ia? ‘O wai nā inoa o ia mau ‘ano ānuenue a pau? He aha ko lākou hi‘ohi‘ona? Pehea e ‘ō‘ili ai kēia mau ‘ano ānuenue ma ke

kuana‘ike Hawai‘i? He aha ko lākou hō‘ailona? Ma muli o ia mau nīnau, ua kupu kekahi mana‘o ma loko o‘u, e ‘imi paha i nā hā‘ina.

No laila, no kēia papahana, ua ‘imi, hō‘ili‘ili, a ho‘ā‘o au e ho‘omaopopo a wehewehe aku i nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole, ‘o ia ho‘i ko lākou hi‘ohi‘ona, ka manawa a me ke kūlana i ka lewa e ‘ō‘ili ai, ko lākou mau hō‘ailona, a me ka pilina o ka ‘ike ānuenue Hawai‘i ku‘una me ka ‘ike ānuenue ‘eprekema o kēia wā nei.

1.3 Nā Nīnau Noi‘i a me Nā Pahuhopu Noi‘i

Aia kauwahi wehewehena pōkole no nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole ma loko o nā puke wehewehe, kekahi kūmole ‘ē a‘e, a me ka hō‘ike mana‘o ‘ana paha o kekahi mau kūpuna. Eia na‘e, ‘o ka pilikia, ‘a‘ole loa‘a kahi palapala kumu nāna e wehewehe i nā ‘ano ānuenue a pau. No ia kumu, ‘o ka mea e pono ai i ka mana‘o o ka mea kākau, ‘o ia ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i kahi mau mea kiko‘ī e pili ana i nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole i mea e mālama ai i kēia ‘ike Hawai‘i ku‘una.

No laila, eia nā nīnau noi‘i no kēia papahana laeo‘o:

1. He aha nā hi‘ohi‘ona o nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole?
2. Ma ka pō‘ai lewa hea e ‘ō‘ili ai nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole?
3. I nā manawa hea e ‘ō‘ili ai nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole?
4. He aha nā hō‘ailona, nā ‘ōuli, a me nā wānana o nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole?
5. Pehea e ho‘ohālikelike ai i ka ‘ike ānuenue Hawai‘i ku‘una me ka ‘ike ānuenue ‘eprekema komohana o kēia au hou?

‘O nā pahuhopu nui o kēia papahana, ‘o ia ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i nā mea he nui e pili ana i nā ‘ano ānuenue a pau. ‘O ia ho‘i ka ‘ohi‘ohi ‘ana a me ka palapala ‘ana i kekahi mau ki‘i, kekahi mau wehewehena, a me kekahi mau ‘ōuli/hō‘ailona o nā ‘ano ānuenue i ‘ike ‘ia i ka wā kahiko. I kēia manawa, ke ‘ike ‘ia kekahi hunahuna ānuenue, kekahi hapa pi‘o, a i ‘ole kekahi ānuenue pālua i ka lewa, ‘a‘ole hiki ke loa‘a kekahi kumu no ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i ke ‘ano, a

me ka hō‘ailona/‘ōuli o ia ānuenue i ke kuana‘ike Hawai‘i. No laila, eia nā mea e kō ai ka pahuhopu nui:

1. E wehewehe i nā hi‘ohi‘ona o nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole.
2. E wehewehe i ka pō‘ai lewa o nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole e ‘ō‘ili ai.
3. E wehewehe i nā manawa o nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole e ‘ō‘ili ai.
4. E wehewehe i nā hō‘ailona, nā ‘ōuli, a me nā wānana o nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole.
5. E ho‘ohālikelike i ka ‘ike ānuenue Hawai‘i ku‘una me ka ‘ike ānuenue ‘epekema komohana o kēia au hou.

Wehewehe ‘ia ia mau pahuhopu he ‘elima ma loko o nā paukū o lalo iho nei (1.3.1 – 1.3.5)

1.3.1 No nā Hi‘ohi‘ona o nā ‘Ano Ānuenue Like ‘Ole

‘Oko‘a nā hi‘ohi‘ona o nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole. ‘Ō‘ili pinepine he ānuenue piha nunui, a ‘ō‘ili pinepine nō ho‘i he ānuenue hapa. No ka ‘ike Hawai‘i, he mea nui ka palapala ‘ana a me ka mālama ‘ana i nā ki‘i o nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole. No laila, ua hō‘oia a ho‘olikelike ‘ia kekahī ki‘i ānuenue me kona ‘ano.

1.3.2 No nā Pō‘ai Lewa o nā ‘Ano Ānuenue Like ‘Ole e ‘Ō‘ili ai

Ma loko o kā Basham palapala noi‘i laeo‘o, he mau ‘ano nui ‘o ka hō‘ike ‘ana i ka pō‘aiapili laulā a puni ke kumuhana kiko‘ī o kāna pepa. He pepa ia e pili ana i nā mele lāhui, mele kūpa‘a, mele kū‘ē, a me nā mele aloha o nā kānaka maoli.¹² ‘O ka pahuhopu nui o ia palapala ka wehewehe ‘ana aku i nā mele lāhui i pa‘i ‘ia i ka makahiki 1893, eia na‘e, ‘a‘ole i ho‘ohāiki wale ‘ia nō ia palapala ma ia makahiki. Wahi a Basham, he waiwai a ko‘iko‘i nā mele lāhui no ka ho‘omaopopo le‘a ‘ana i ka mo‘olelo Hawai‘i. No laila, ua hō‘ike pōkole ‘ia ka mo‘olelo Hawai‘i o ka wā ma mua a me ka pilina o ia mo‘olelo i nā mele o nā Kānaka Maoli. Wehewehe ‘ia ia mo‘olelo mai ka ho‘okumu honua (‘o ia ho‘i, ke Kumulipo) a i ka makahiki 1898 (‘o ia ka ho‘ohui ‘āina). Maopopo i ia mea kākau ka waiwai o ka hō‘ike ‘ana i ka pō‘aiapili mō‘aukala

holo‘oko‘a a puni ka makahiki āna i no‘ono‘o pono ai, ‘o ia ho‘i ka makahiki 1893. E like me kēlā, no kēia papahana noi‘i nei, he mea maika‘i nō ka wehewehe ‘ana i ka pō‘aiapili o nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole nāna e ‘ō‘ili mai. ‘Oiai, he ‘ō‘ili ke ānuenue i ka lewa, aia ka pono ‘o ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i ke ‘ano a ka Hawai‘i e kūlulu ai i ka lewa. Ma ke kuana‘ike‘epekema komohana, ‘o ka ‘ō‘ili ‘ana o ke ānuenue, ‘o ia ma muli o ke kūlana o ka lā, ka nui kūpono o nā huna wai ma loko o ke aouli, a me ke kau ‘ana o ka lā ma hope o ka mea nānā. Eia nō na‘e, nui ‘ino nā la‘ana ma loko o nā mo‘olelo Hawai‘i ku‘una, o ka ‘ō‘ili ‘ana o kahi ‘ano ānuenue i kekahi manawa ‘ē a‘e, a e kū‘ē ana i ka ‘ike ‘epekema komohana. No kēia pahuhopu, ‘o ia ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i ka manawa o nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole e ‘ō‘ili ai ma ke kuana‘ike o ka Hawai‘i e pili ana i ke kuana‘ike ‘epekema komohana.

1.3.4 No nā Hō‘ailona, nā ‘Ōuli, a me nā Wānana Pili i nā ‘Ano Ānuenue Like ‘ole

‘O kēia pahuhopu, ‘o ia ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i ka nui a me ke ‘ano o nā hō‘ailona, nā ‘ōuli, a me nā wānana e pili ana i nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole. Ua pa‘a paha ka ‘ike o ia mau mea ma loko o nā kūmole ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i kahiko, a ma ka na‘au o kekahi mau kūpuna e ola ana i kēia au nei.

1.4 No Ke Ki‘ina Hana Noi‘i

 - ii. ‘O ka huli hohonu nō ho‘i no ia mau hua‘olelo ma loko o nā wehewehena.
2. Ua ho‘ohui ‘ia nā ‘ano ānuenue ma muli o ko lākou wehewehena like.
3. Ua ‘ohi‘ohi ‘ia kekahi mau ki‘i ānuenue he nui, a me ka mahu‘i na‘auao, ho‘opili ‘ia me ia wehewehena o kēlā me kēia ‘ano ānuenue.
4. Ua nīnauele ‘ia kekahi mau mea mānaleo, mea kūpuna, mea kumu he ‘eiwa no ko lākou ho‘omaopopo ‘ana:
 - i. He mau ki‘i e pili ana i ka wehewehena.
 - ii. He mau hō‘ailona a he mau ‘ōuli o kekahi ‘ano ānuenue.
 - iii. He manawa a he pō‘ai lewa o kekahi ‘ano ānuenue e ‘ō‘ili pinepine ai.
 - iv. He mo‘olelo pono‘ī e pili ana i ke ānuenue.

- i. Ua huli ‘ia ka Papakilo Database a me ka Nupepa.org no nā ‘ano ānuenue a pau.

Ua ho‘ohana ‘ia nā hua‘ōlelo ‘ano ānuenue a pau, a me kekahi mau huli boolean, e la‘a, “ānuenue AND hoailona”, a pēlā aku. E kau ‘ia ana ia mau ‘atikala i loa‘a ma loko o kekahi waihona no ka heluhelu a kālailai ‘ana.

6. Ua ho‘olohe ‘ia kekahi mau lola, e la‘a ka papahana lekiō ‘o Ka Leo Hawa‘i. Ua ho‘olohe ‘ia 250 lola, a ua loa‘a ‘ehiku lola nona kekahi mau ‘ike e pili ana i ke ‘ano ānuenue. Penei ka huli ana:

- ii. Ka waihona lola a Kawena Pukui ma ka hale hō‘ike‘ike o Kamehameha. Ua loa‘a ‘ehā lola i ho‘olohe ai ma o ka “finding aid” ma ia waihona.

- i. Malia paha, e loa‘a ana ka hapa nui o ka ‘ike e pili ana i nā ‘ano ānuenue ma loko o nā kūmole kākau. No laila, ua koho ‘ia iho he ‘umi mo‘olelo/ka‘ao Hawai‘i ku‘una no ka heluhelu a kālailai ‘ana i nā ‘ano ānuenue e ‘ō‘ili ana ma loko o ia mau mo‘olelo. Eia ia mau mo‘olelo, ‘o Lā‘ieikawai, ‘o Keaomelemele, ‘o ‘Aukelenuiaikū, ‘o Kahalaopuna, ‘o Hi‘iakaikapoliopele, ‘o Kawelo, ‘o ‘Umialīloa, ‘o Kekūhaupi‘o, ‘o Kamapua‘a, a me Hainakolo.¹³ Ua kālailai ‘ia ka pō‘aiapili a me nā hō‘ailona o nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole ma loko o ia mau kūmole. ‘O ke ‘ano hana i ho‘ohana ‘ia no ka ho‘o‘ili‘ili ‘ana i nā ‘ikepili hō‘ailona, ua kālailai ‘ia ka pō‘aiapili i kēlā me kēia ānuenue i kupu ma loko o nā mo‘olelo no ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i kona hō‘ailona. Kohu ia ki‘ina hana noi‘i i ke ki‘ina a Keoni Kelekolio i ho‘ohana ai i kāna papahana laeo‘o e pili ana i nā waiho‘olu‘u Hawai‘i.¹⁴ Ua ho‘ohana ‘ia nō ho‘i kekahi mau nīnauele he nui e Keiko Kiele Akana Gooch Gonzalez i kāna papahana laeo‘o e pili ana i nā loina kapa inoa kanaka Hawai‘i.¹⁵

Wahi a Wong, ‘a‘ole hiki ke loa‘a kekahi kūmole nāna e hō‘ike i ke ‘ano ki‘ina hana noi‘i Hawai‘i pono. Eia kekahi, ‘a‘ole kākou e kaupalena ‘ia i ke ‘ano ki‘ina hana noi‘i ‘epukema a ka haole. Aia nō kahi ki‘ina hana ‘oko‘a, ‘o ia ho‘i ke ki‘ina hana noi‘i ūlialia pōmaika‘i. Ma kēia ‘ano hana, na ka ‘ike e hō‘ike iā ia iho i ka mea ‘imi noi‘i. ‘A‘ole na‘e kauka‘i kēia ki‘ina hana noi‘i i ka pōmaika‘i. He mea ‘ano nui nō ka hō‘ike ‘ana i ka pō‘aiapili a me ke kuana‘ike i ka manawa a nā mea nānā e unuhi ana i ka ‘ō‘ili ‘ana o kekahi ānuenu. Eia na‘e, he aha ia mea he kuana‘ike? ‘O ke kuana‘ike o kekahi lāhui, ‘o ia ke ‘ano o ko lākou ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i ke ‘ano o ke ao.¹⁸ Ma loko o ia kuana‘ike, aia nā mea a pau nāna e kūkulu i ko lākou ‘oia‘i‘o. ‘O ia ho‘i nā mea mahu‘i, ke ‘ano mana‘o, nāloina, ka lawena pono, ka pilina me ka honua, nā mea waiwai, a pēlā aku. ‘O ke kuana‘ike, ‘o ia ke ‘ano o ko ka Hawai‘i a me ko ka haole ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i ke ao kūloheloh, a pau pū nō ho‘i me ke ānuenu. ‘Oko‘a ke kuana‘ike Hawai‘i, ‘oko‘a ke kuana‘ike haole (‘o ia ho‘i ke Kalikiano a me ka mea ‘epukema). ‘O ia ho‘i, lehulehu nō nā mea kuana‘ike ‘oko‘a ma waena o ia mau lāhui he ‘elua, a hiki paha ke wehewehe ‘ia nā ‘oko‘a e nā mo‘omeheu, nā ‘ōlelo, a me nāloina.¹⁹ E kilo ‘ia ia mau kuana‘ike i mea e ho‘omaopopo ai i nā ‘ano ānuenu ma loko o ka mana‘o Hawai‘i a me ka mana‘o haole. E wehewehe ‘ia ia mau kuana‘ike ma ke ‘ano laulā, a ‘a‘ole pili ia ‘ōlelo laulā i kēlā me kēia kanaka ma loko o ia mau lāhui, ‘a‘ole ia he mea ho‘okahi, no ka mea, ‘a‘ohe pau ka ‘ike i ka hālau ho‘okahi.²⁰

2.1 Ke Kuana‘ike Haole e Pili Ana i Ke Ao Kūloheloh

‘O ka ho‘omana Kalikiano paha ka mea ‘ano nui nāna e ho‘ohuli mana‘o i mea e pa‘a ai ke kuana‘ike haole no ke ao kūloheloh. Mana‘o ‘ia e ke Kalikiano, ‘o ka ho‘okumu ‘ia o ka ‘āina, ke kai, ka lewa, nā holoholona, a me nā mea a pau a kākou kānaka e ho‘ohana ai, na ko lākou akua ho‘okahi nō ia i hana. ‘O ia ho‘i, ‘oi aku ke kūlana ki‘eki‘e o nā kānaka a pau ma mua o nā mea like ‘ole o ke ao kūloheloh. Eia kekahi, wahi a White, ‘a‘ole kumu no ke ola ‘ana

o nā mea o ka honua, koe ka ho‘ohana ‘ia e nā kānaka.²¹ Eia hou kekahi, ua ‘ike ‘ia ke ao kūlohelohelohe i kona ‘ano weliweli, a piha nō ho‘i me nā holoholona ‘āhiu ‘ino, ke kanaka hihiu loa, a me nā mea ‘ai kanaka. He wahi nō ho‘i no Kākana, he wahi kapu ‘ole. Wahi a Calvin, ‘o nā mea wale nō i pakele i kona ‘ano kūlohelohelohe, ‘o ia wale nō nā mea e hiki ke hana pono.²² He kuana‘ike ia nāna e wehewehe i ke ‘ano o ke ao kūlohelohelohe he mea e ho‘ohana wale ‘ia nō. He mea ia na ke kanaka e ho‘ohana huikau ai no kona pono a me kona kū‘ono‘ono nō ho‘i, me ka nānā ‘ole i ke ola a me ka pōmaika‘i o ke ao kūlohelohelohe holo‘oko‘a. He aha nā hopena o kēia kuana‘ike? Pehea e ho‘ohuli mana‘o ai ia kuana‘ike i ka lawena o nā Kalikiano?

I mea e ho‘omaopopo ai i nā hopena o ia kuana‘ike ao kūlohelohelohe, ‘o ka mea e pono ai ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i ko ke Kalikiano kuana‘ike e pili ana i ka hana a i ‘ole ka‘oihana. ‘O ia ho‘i ka waiwai a ke Kalikiano e hilina‘i iho ai i ka hana nui loa a me ka ‘ohi‘ohi ‘ana i nā mea waiwai a me ka pu‘u kālā. Hilina‘i ‘ia e nā Kalikiano (e la‘a nā Calvinists), he kuleana nui ka hahai ‘ana i ke ala waiwai, no ka mea, ho‘onui nō ka pilina pono a ke kanaka me ke akua ho‘okahi ma o kāna hana nui.²³ ‘Ōlelo pinepine ‘ia, e hana ana ‘o ia i ka hana o ke akua. Eia kekahi, pehea e hō‘ike aku ai ke Kalikiano i kāna hana nui i ke akua? He aha ka hō‘ailona nāna e hō‘ike i kāna hana nui? ‘O ka hā‘ina, ‘o ia kāna mau waiwai. No laila, inā, hiki i ke kanaka ke ‘ohi‘ohi i ka waiwai he nui, a laila, ulu nō ho‘i kona pilina pono me ke akua Kalikiano. He pulakaumaka nō ka mana‘o i ka hana nui, a ‘o ia ke kahua o ke kuana‘ike hana o ke Kalikiano, a no laila, o ka haole kekahi. Eia na‘e, pehea e ho‘ololi ai i ke kuana‘ike hana o ka haole a lilo mai ai he kuana‘ike ao kūlohelohelohe?

Malia paha, he Kalikiano ka hapa nui loa o nā haole. I kēia au hou, noho iho ia mau kuana‘ike he ‘elua ma loko o kona mea ōewe, i loko nō o kona hilina‘i a i ‘ole hilina‘i ‘ole i ia pilina ma waena o kāna hana nui me ke akua. Eia na‘e, koe nō kona kuana‘ike ē he mea ke ao kūlohelohelohe i ho‘okumu ‘ia nona pono‘ī. No laila, ‘a‘ohe mālama ‘āina o ka hapa nui o ka haole. ‘O ka hopena o ia kuana‘ike, ‘o ia ka mālama ‘ole ‘ia o nā kumuwaiwai kūlohelohelohe, a me ka ho‘ohaumia ‘ia o nā kahawai, ke ea, ka ‘āina, a pēlā aku. 1. ‘O ka pelika ma waena o ke akua Kalikiano me Noah. Ma hope o ka wai hālana nunui, ho‘ohiki ke akua iā Noah, ‘a‘ole loa ‘o ia e luku hou i ka honua me kekahi wai hālana. He mea ho‘ohali‘a ke ānuenu no kā ke akua Kalikiano pelika a me kona aloha no ke kanaka.
2. ‘O ka ho‘okumu ‘ia ‘ana o ka honua, ke kanaka, a me ka holoholona.
3. He uapo ia mai ka honua a‘e a i ka lani. He hō‘ailona ia no ko ke kanaka mana‘olana a me ke aloha o ke akua.

‘A‘ole ‘ike ‘ia, he ānuenue pi‘o piha a i ‘ole he ānuenue hapa paha, a no laila, mahu‘i ‘ia, hiki paha ke ho‘omaopopo ‘ia ia mau hō‘ailona no kēlā me kēia ānuenue e ‘ō‘ili ana i ka lewa i ke kuana‘ike o ke Kalikiano.

Ua ho‘omaopopo ‘ia iwakālua ‘ano ānuenu a ‘oi i ka wā kahiko. Eia kekahi, he mau ‘ike ku‘una ko nā po‘e maoli a puni ka honua e pili ana i nā mea o ka lewa, e la‘a, nui ‘ino nā hua‘ōlelo no nā ‘ano hau ma loko o ka ‘ōlelo Inuit.³³ Ho‘omaoe ‘ia ka pilina hohonu ma waena o ka Hawai‘i, ka ‘āina, ke ao kūlohelohelohe, a me ke ānuenu ma loko o ka Pakuhi 2 o luna a‘e. E wehewehe ‘ia nā ‘ano ānuenu ma loko o ka Mokuna 3 o lalo iho. Nui nā hō‘ailona a ka Hawai‘i i ho‘omaopopo iho ai e pili ana i ke ānuenu. 

a‘e nei. E ho‘ohālike ‘ia kekahi o nā mea kuana‘ike o ka Hawai‘i a me ka haole (‘o ia ho‘i ke Kalikiano a me ke kanaka ‘epékema) ma loko o kēia māhele. Hiki ke ‘ike ‘ia kekahi mau mea ‘ano o ke kuana‘ike i loko o ka Pakuhi 3. Lehulehu nō nā ‘oko‘a ma nā kuana‘ike o ia mau lāhui, a hiki paha ke wehewehe ‘ia nā ia mau ‘ano ma o nā mo‘omeheu a me nā loina. Wahi a Agar, aia he ‘elua ‘ano hana no ke kālailai ‘ana i nā mea ‘oko‘a o kekahi mau lāhui ‘elua. ‘O ke ‘ano mua ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana ē aia he ‘elua ‘ōnaehana no ka nānā ‘ana i ka honua, a nui nō nā mea e ‘oko‘a ai ia mau ‘ōnaehana. ‘O ke ‘ano ‘elua, ‘o ia ka nānā ‘ana i nā mea o kekahi lāhui e nele ai i ka manawa o nā lāhui ‘elua e ho‘ohālikelike ‘ia ana. Kapa ‘ia kēia ‘o ka “deficit-theory approach”.³⁵ ‘Oko‘a nō nā mea kuana‘ike e hō‘ike ‘ia ana ma loko o ka Pakuhi 3. He ahuwale nō ia. Ua nele ia lāhui haole i ka mahalo ‘ole i ke ao kūlohelohelohe a me ke ānuenu.

Ma ke kuana‘ike haole, ‘oi aku ke kūlana o ke kanaka ma mua o ko nā mea ola ‘ē a‘e a pau. Ma ke kuana‘ike Hawai‘i, he lālā wale nō ke kanaka no ke ao kūlohelohelohe. Hiki ke ‘ike ‘ia ia mau kuana‘ike ma loko o ka Pakuhi 4.³⁶

2.6 He Mau Mana‘o Pani

Ua hō‘ike ‘ia ke kuana‘ike Hawai‘i a me ke kuana‘ike haole e pili ana i ke ao kūlohelohē a me ke ānuenu. ‘Oko‘a nō ia mau kuana‘ike, a ‘a‘ole e ‘ole, lehulehu nō ho‘i nā kuana‘ike like ‘ole a puni ka honua e pili ana i ke ānuenu. Eia kekahi mau la‘ana: Ma ke kuana‘ike o ka po‘e Pākē Lanzhou, he mo‘o lani nunui ke ānuenu nāna e inu i kekahi wai, a hō‘ehu i ia wai ma ke ‘ano he ua.³⁸ Ma ka ‘āina ‘o Java, ua mana‘o ‘ia, he kino mo‘o nunui ko ke ānuenu, a kīko‘o kona kino ma luna o ka mokupuni. He po‘o kia a i ‘ole he po‘o pipi nā palena o ke ānuenu. Inu kekahi o nā po‘o mai ke kai ‘o Java, a inu kekahi po‘o ‘ē a‘e mai ka moana ‘o ‘Iniana. Iā lāua e mā‘ona ai, lua‘i ‘ia ka wai mai loko a‘e o ka ‘ōpū ma ke ‘ano he ua.³⁹ Ma ke kuana‘ike o ka po‘e Muria ma ka ‘āina ‘o ‘Inia, he naheka nunui ke ānuenu, a ‘o Bhumtaras kona inoa. Puka ‘o Bhumtaras mai kona pu‘u naonao no ke kū ‘ana mai i ka ua.⁴⁰

Hoihoi loa nō nā kuana‘ike like ‘ole a puni ka honua. ‘O ka ‘ō‘ili ‘ana o ke ānuenu, he mea kupaihana no nā lāhui like ‘ole. Ma kēia pae ‘āina nei, ahuwale paha, ‘oko‘a loa ke kuana‘ike haole, ‘oko‘a loa ke kuana‘ike Hawai‘i.

Mokuna 3 Nā ‘Ano Ānuenue

Nui ‘ino nō nā ‘ano ānuenue e ‘kau ana i ka lewa ma luna o Hawai‘i. He mau hua‘olelo kiko‘ī ko ka ‘olelo Hawai‘i no ia mau ‘ano ānuenue. He iwakālua a ‘oi i loa‘a i nā Kānaka Maoli i ka wā ma mua. Pili ia mau hua‘olelo kiko‘ī i nā ‘ano ānuenue like ‘ole ‘o ka hi‘ohi‘ona. Ma loko o kēia mokuna nei e wehewehe ‘ia ai kēia mau ‘ano. ‘O nā hopena noi‘i no kēlā me kēia ‘ano ānuenue ke hō‘ike ‘ia ana ma loko o ka Mokuna 5 o lalo iho.

3.1 No Nā ‘Ano Ānuenue

‘O ka manu kahi hua‘olelo laulā, a ‘o ka ‘i‘iwi kahi hua‘olelo kiko‘ī no kekahi ‘ano manu. E like me ia la‘ana, he mau hua‘olelo laulā ko ka ‘olelo Hawai‘i i ho‘ohana ‘ia i ka wā kahiko no ke kuhikuhi ‘ana i nā waiho‘olu‘u i ‘ō‘ili i ka lewa. Eia kekahi mau la‘ana:

1. Ke Ānuenue: ‘O ia ka hua‘olelo laulā ma‘amau e ho‘ohana ‘ia ana no nā ‘ano lihi a pau i kēia manawa.⁴¹ Ke ‘ō‘ili kekahi mau waiho‘olu‘u i ka lewa i kēia au nei, ho‘opuka pinepine ‘ia, “E nānā a‘e, aia kahi ānuenue he nani ma loko o ka lewa.” Ma ke kuana‘ike o kahi kumu, e ho‘ohana wale ‘ia nō kēia hua‘olelo no ka pi‘o piha o nā waiho‘o‘olu‘u ānuenue.⁴² Eia na‘e, ‘o ka hua‘olelo ānuenue i kēia au nei, ho‘ohana pinepine loa ‘ia e ka hapa nui loa o ka po‘e Hawai‘i no nā ‘ano ānuenue a pau.
2. Ka Lihi: Wahi a Andrews,⁴³ ‘o ka lihi, ‘o ia nō ke ānuenue pono‘ī iho nō. Ma ka ‘ikepili i ‘ohi ‘ia no kēia papahana nei, kāka‘ikahi nō ka ho‘opuka ‘ana i kēia hua‘olelo i ka pō‘aiapili ānuenue.

3. Ka Mākole: ‘O ia kahi inoa Hawai‘i no ke ānuenu i lohe pinepine ‘ia i ka wā kahiko,⁴⁴ akā, kāka‘ikahi loa kona ho‘opuka ‘ia ‘ana i kēia mau lā. Ma loko o kahi ‘atikala nūpepa: “O ko‘u manao hope aia no ia maluna o ka huaolelo Makole. Oia ka inoa Hawaii kahiko o ke anuenue a‘u i lohe pinepine ai i ko‘u mau la kamalii, a he kakaikahi loa kona hoopuka i keia mau la.”⁴⁵ ‘O ka mea ma‘amau, i kēia mau lā, pili nō ka mākole me ka pō, ‘o ia ho‘i, he pō mākole. Eia kekahī, he māpumana‘o ko ka hua‘ōlelo mākole, ‘o ia kekahī mea ‘ula‘ula. Ua pili pinepine ka mākole i nā ānuenu ‘ula, ‘o ia ho‘i, ‘o ka pūnōhu ‘ula a me ka uakoko. I kekahī manawa he kūamuamu ka mākole.⁴⁶
4. Ke Ao Akua: He ‘ōlelo ho‘ohālike kēia māmala‘ōlelo no ke ānuenu. ‘O ia ho‘i, he ao i ho‘opā ‘ia e ke akua.⁴⁷ ‘Oiai, he ‘ōlelo ho‘ohālikelike, ‘a‘ole ona pilina i kekahī ‘ano ānuenu kiko‘ī. Eia kekahī, mana‘o ‘ia nō ho‘i, he hua‘ōlelo laha kēia no nā hō‘ailona iā ha‘i.
5. Ka Haka ‘ula a Kāne: He ‘ōlelo ho‘ohālike nō ho‘i kēia māmala‘ōlelo no ke ānuenu. Eia kekahi, wahi a Malo a me Kamakau, ua kūkulu ‘ia a‘e ka lewa i kekahi mau pō‘ai i mea e ho‘omaopopo ai i ke ‘ano o nā mea e kupu pinepine mai ana ma luna o ka honua, ‘o ke ao ‘oe, ‘o

‘Ō‘ili ke ānuenuue ma loko o kekahī mau pō‘ai lewa. Eia kekahī, i ka hapa nui o ka manawa, kauka‘i ka ‘ō‘ili ‘ana ma ke ‘ano ānuenuue a me ka pō‘ai o ka lā. Ua mahu‘i ‘ia ke ki‘eki‘ena o nā pō‘ai lewa ma loko o kēia mokuna nei i mea e ho‘omaopopo ai i nā pō‘ai lewa o nā ‘ano ānuenuue e ‘ō‘ili a‘e ai.

4.1 Nā Hālau Na‘auao Hawai‘i a ‘Ekolu

No ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i nā pō‘ai lewa a me nā pō‘ai Kahiki, ‘o ka mea mua e pono ai ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i ka ‘ōnaehana ‘ike a ka po‘e Hawai‘i e kūkulu ai no ke ao kūlohelohelo. Ho‘omāhele ‘ia ke ao kūlohelohelo i loko o ‘ekolu hālau na‘auao e nā kānaka maoli. Aia ma loko o ka wā ‘umi kūmākolu o ke Kumulipo (ka lālā o ka wā ‘umi kūmālua), hiki ke loa‘a ia mau māhele na‘auao.⁵⁹ E wehewehe ‘ia ia mau hālau ma lalo iho nei.⁶⁰

1. O Papahulihonua: Aia ka honua a me ka moana ma loko o Papahulihonua. ‘O ia ho‘i ka mōhala ‘ana a me ka loli ‘ana o ka honua a me ka moana. Aia nō ho‘i kauwahi kānaka loea i ‘ike i ka pilina o ka honua, ka lewa, a me nā mea ola.⁶¹
2. O Papahulilani: ‘O ia ka lewa mai ka honua a hiki i kahi o nā hōkū e kau ai. Aia ma loko o Papahulilani ka lā, nā hōkū, ka makani, ke ānuenuue, a pēlā aku. Aia nō ho‘i kauwahi

3. ‘O Papanuihānaumoku: Mai ke aka a hiki i ka make e noho iho ai nā mea ola a pau i ka hālau na‘auao ‘o Papanuihānaumoku. ‘O ia nō nā mea ulu a pau a me nā holoholona a pau. Aia nō ho‘i kauwahi kānaka loea i ‘ike i ka pilina o ka honua, ka lewa, a me nā mea ola.

‘O ia mau hālau na‘auao a ‘ekolu, ‘o ia ka ‘ōnaehana ‘ike Hawai‘i, a ‘o ia ke kahua no ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i ke ao kūlohelohelohe i ke kuana‘ike Hawai‘i.⁶²

4.2 ‘O Papahulilani

‘O ka hālau ‘o Papahulilani kahi o nā ‘ano ānuenu e ‘ō‘ili ai. Malia paha, ‘oi aku ka nui o Papahulilani ma mua o ko nā hālau ‘ike Hawai‘i ‘ē a‘e. Ho‘oloa a‘e nō ia i ke aupuni o nā akua a hiki i ka lanikuakaa. ‘O Kāne (Kāne-nui-ākea) lāua ‘o Kanaloa nā akua kuamua, a ‘o Kū lāua ‘o Lono nā akua kualua.⁶³ Ho‘olako ‘ia nā mea o ka lewa e ia mau akua. Kalakupua nō ho‘i nā mea o Papahulilani ma muli o ia mau akua. Kilo ‘ia ka ho‘omāhele ‘ana i ua Papahulilani nei ma loko o kēia mokuna nei, ‘o ia ho‘i, nā pō‘ai lewa a me nā pō‘ai Kahiki.

4.2.1 Nā Pō‘ai o ka Lewa

‘Oiai, no ka lewa ke ānuenu, ‘o ka mea e pono ai ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i ke ‘ano i kūkulu ‘ia ai ia wahi, wahi a Malo, ‘ehā pō‘ai o ka lewa ma waena o ka pa‘a i luna a me ka pa‘a i lalo.⁶⁴ Wehewehe ‘ia kēia mau pō‘ai lewa ma lalo iho nei, a hō‘ike ‘ia i ka Pakuhi 7.⁶⁵



‘oe, ka ‘amakihi ‘oe, ka ‘io ‘oe, ka piha ‘ekelo ‘oe, a pēlā aku.⁶⁸ Hō‘ike wale mai nō ‘o Malo, aia ka pō‘ai lewa lani lewa ma lalo o ka lewa nu‘u. He mea hoihoi, wahi a ka mea ho‘oponopono i kā Malo puke (2020): he inoa ‘ano ‘ē ka lewa lani lewa, a mana‘o ‘o ia, he hewa.⁶⁹

‘Oko‘a ka ‘ike o Malo, a ‘oko‘a ka ‘ike o Kamakau e pili ana i ke kūkulu lewa.⁷¹ Ma ka ‘ikepili i ‘ohi ‘ia mai kā Kamakau, ‘eono pō‘ai lewa ma waena o ka pa‘a i luna a me ka pa‘a i lalo. Wehewehe ‘ia ma lalo iho nei, a hō‘ike ‘ia i ka Pakuhi 8.⁷²



8. Ka Pa‘a i lalo: ‘O ia kahi pili pa‘a i ka honua.

Pa‘akikī paha ka ho‘ohālike ‘ana i ka ‘ōnaehana kūkulu a Malo me kā Kamakau, no ka mea, ‘a‘ole wehewehe ‘o Kamakau i ka pō‘ai ma lalo o ka lewa nu‘u, a ma luna o ka hakaalewa. Kohu mea lā, ‘o ia ka pō‘ai i kapa ‘ia ‘o ka lewa lani lewa e Malo, eia na‘e, ‘a‘ole maopopo pono.

‘Oko‘a ka ‘ōnaehana o Malo, ‘okoa ka ‘ōnaehana o Kamakau. ‘O ka ‘ōnaehana hea ka mea pololei? Inā loa‘a kekahī mau mana ‘oko‘a o nā mo‘olelo Hawai‘i ku‘una, ua pololei nō paha ia mau mana a ‘elua. ‘O ia ho‘i, ua ha‘i ‘ia ua mau mo‘olelo nei e nā kānaka ‘oko‘a nona nā mana‘o ‘oko‘a. Malia paha, e like me ia mau mo‘olelo Hawai‘i ku‘una, pololei pū kā Malo lāua ‘o kā Kamakau. E ku‘u mea heluhelu, ‘a‘ole e koho iho ana kou mea kākau i ka ‘ōnaehana pololei. No laila, ua ho‘ohana ‘ia ia mau ‘ōnaehana lā a ‘elua.

He nīnau hoihoi paha, he aha ke ki‘eki‘ena o ia mau pō‘ai? ‘A‘ole i ana ‘ia e Malo a i ‘ole e Kamakau me ka ho‘ohana ‘ana i ka ‘ōnaehana komohana o ka haole. He nīnau ‘ano nui, ‘oiai, ‘oko‘a loa nō ke kuana‘ike haole, ‘oko‘a loa nō ke kuana‘ike Hawai‘i. Pono anei paha ka hō‘ike ‘ana i ka ‘ike Hawai‘i ma loko o ka ‘ōnaehana haole, a pono anei paha ka hō‘ike ‘ana i ka ‘ike haole ma loko o ka ‘ōnaehana Hawai‘i? I ke kuana‘ike o ka haole, ‘o ka ‘epukema wale nō ka mea e hō‘ike ana i nā mea ‘oia‘i‘o. 1. Ka lewa ho‘omakua: ‘Oko‘a ka wehwewehena a Malo, ‘oko‘a ka wehewehe ‘ana a

Kamakau e pili ana i ke ki‘eki‘e o kēia pō‘ai. E like me ka wehewehena o luna a‘e, wahi a Kamakau, e kū ana kekahi kanaka ma ka honua, a pupu‘u a‘e kekahi wāwae i luna, a pa‘a kekahi wāwae i ka honua.⁷⁵ ‘O kēia ki‘eki‘e, ma kahi paha ia o ‘elua kapua‘i. Wahi a Malo, inā i pa‘a ke kanaka i kekahi kumu lā‘au a lewa kona mau wāwae, ‘o ia ka lewa ho‘omakua.⁷⁶ ‘O ke kumu lā‘au hea kā Malo o ke kuhi ‘ana? Eia kekahi mahu‘i: ‘oi aku ke ki‘eki‘e o ke kumu Koa ma mua o nā kumu ‘ē a‘e, a ulu paha ia a hiki i ke ki‘eki‘e he 115 kapua‘i.⁷⁷ A mai ka lālā hea e lewa ai nā wāwae? Inā, pa‘a kekahi kanaka (ma kahi o 6 kapua‘i kona ki‘eki‘e) i kekahi lālā ha‘aha‘a (ma kahi paha o 10 kapua‘i ke ki‘eki‘e), e lewa ana kona wāwae ma kahi o 4 kapua‘i. Ua hō‘ike ‘ia e kekahi kumu ‘ē a‘e,⁷⁸ aia ka pō‘ai lewa ho‘omakua e holo ana mai ke kumu o kekahi kumu lā‘au pōkole (a i ‘ole ke po‘o kanaka) a hiki i ka wēlau o ke kumu lā‘au ki‘eki‘e (‘o ke kumu Koa paha), ‘o ia ho‘i, ma kahi ia o 115 kaupa‘i. Me he mea lā, ‘a‘ole i ho‘oloa a hiki i 115 kapua‘i ma muli o nā wehewehena o nā pō‘ai lewa ‘ē a‘e. No laila, no kēia papahana nei, ‘o ka mahu‘i ‘ana no ke ki‘eki‘ena, he ‘ekolu paha kapua‘i o ka lewa ho‘omakua.

2. Ka hakaalewa: Ma ka ‘ikepili i ‘ohi ‘ia ma loko mai o kā Kamakau puke, inā, e ho‘olewa iho kekahi kanaka i kona wāwae i ka manawa āna e pa‘a ana i kekahi lālā kumulā‘au, aia kona wāwae ma loko o ka pō‘ai hakaalewa. No laila, he 4 kapua‘i paha ke ki‘eki‘e (a nānā ‘ia ka wehewehena no ka lewa ho‘omakua ma luna a‘e nei).
3. Ka lewa lani lewa: ‘A‘ole ho‘opuka ‘o Kamakau i kēia pō‘ai. ‘O Malo wale nō kai

hāpai i ia mana‘o. Aia ia ma lalo o ka lewa nu‘u. Eia na‘e, ua ho‘opuka ‘ia e kekahi kumu ‘ē a‘e,⁷⁹ mai ka wēlau o ke kumu lā‘au ki‘eki‘e a i ke kumu o nā ao, aia ka pō‘ai lewa lani lewa. Loa‘a ka ‘ohu a me ka noe i loko o kēia pō‘ai a ‘o ia ka pō‘ai a nā manu li‘ili‘i e lele a‘e ai. Hiki ke ho‘ohana ‘ia kēia ki‘eki‘ena no ke kuhi ‘ana i ke ki‘eki‘e o ka lewa lani lewa. ‘O ka piha ‘ekelo, he lele ‘o ia a hiki i 9,800 kapua‘i ma luna o ka ‘ilikai.⁸⁰ ‘O ka ‘i‘iwi, he 4,100 kapua‘i,⁸¹ a ‘o ka ‘amakihi, he 9,500 kapua‘i.⁸² Hiki nō ho‘i ke ho‘ohana ‘ia ka huina he iwakālua i hō‘ike ‘ia ma loko o ka Pakuhi 9 i mea e akāka ai. Ma ka huina iwakālua ma luna o ka hālāwai, ‘o ia ke ki‘eki‘e ma kahi o 6,000 kapua‘i. He 7,300 kapua‘i ka ‘awelika o ia mau ‘ikepili ki‘eki‘ena . No laila, aia paha nā palena o ka lewa lani lewa ma waena o 3 a 7,300 kapua‘i.

4. Ka lewa nu‘u: ‘O kēia ka pō‘ai a nā manu nui e lele ai.⁸³ ‘O ia ho‘i, ‘o ka mōlī ‘oe, ke ka‘upu ‘oe, ka ‘ā ‘oe, ka ‘iwa ‘oe, a pēlā aku. Lele pinepine ka ‘iwa ma kahi o 13,000 kapua‘i ke ki‘eki‘e.⁸⁴ ‘O ke kōlea, hiki iā ia ke lele a‘e a i 16,000 kapua‘i.⁸⁵ He 14,500 kapua‘i ka ‘awelika o ia mau ki‘eki‘ena lele. No laila, ‘o ke ki‘eki‘ena o ka lewa nu‘u, ‘o ia paha ma waena o 7,300 a me 14,500 kapua‘i ma luna o ka pa‘i i lalo.
5. ‘O keapoalewa: Aia ia ma waena o nā pō‘ai lewa nu‘u a me kamaku‘ialewa. No laila,





He hō‘ailona ke ānuenue no ko ke akua mana nui, penei: “O ka wehewehe ana aku i na kumu oiaio maoli a me ka hoakaka ana aku, i na loina maopopo loa e pili ana i ke Anuenue a ko ke Akua Mana i kau aku ai ma ke Aouli o ka Lani; oia no kekahi o na Kumuaioike maoli i kupono i ka uhane ike a ke Akua i haawi mai ai i ke kanaka, i mea e kokua ai i kona hoomaopopo maoli ana aku i ko ke AKUA MANA NUI KIEKIE LOA.”¹⁰⁴

Ma loko o kā Fornander puke, ua wehewehe ‘ia nā hō‘ailona ānuenue penei: “O keia mau hoailona, mau keia o ka oihanakahuna, e pili ana i ka nele, a me ka loaa, i ka pono a me ka pomaikai, no ka mea, i ka mea maa o kekahi poe, he hoailona no ka nele keia mau hoailona, a ma ke kulana hoi a kekahi poe, he hoailona no ka pomaikai.”¹⁰⁵

I kekahi mau manawa e ‘ō‘ili ai ke ānuenue ma luna o Halema‘uma‘u ma Kīlauea ma ke ‘ano he ‘ōuli o kekahi lua‘i pele. I ke Kēkēmapa o ka makahiki 1931, ua pa‘i kekahi nūpepa i kahi mo‘olelo e pili ana i kekahi mau ānuenue ma loko o Halema‘uma‘u. Ua helu ‘ia ‘eono ānuenue i kuhikuhi i ka hikina ma loko o ka lua pele ‘o Halema‘uma‘u, a ma ka lā ma hope a‘e, ‘o ka ho‘omaka a‘ela nō ia o ka lua‘i pele.¹⁰⁶ Ua ‘ike pinepine ‘ia kekahi mau ānuenue like ma loko o ia lua pele i kēia au nei, a ho‘omaopopo ka po‘e Hawai‘i, ‘o ia kekahi ‘ōuli i ka ho‘i ‘ana

o Pele i Halema‘uma‘u a me ka lua‘i koke ‘ana o ka pele.¹⁰⁷ Eia kekahi, wahi a kekahi kumu, ‘o ke ānuenue, ‘o ia kahi kino lau o Pele.¹⁰⁸ Eia hou kekahi, ‘ewalu kaikaina o Pele i kapa ‘ia ‘o Hi‘iaka, a he mau hō‘ailona ānuenue ko kekahi ‘elua o ua mau Hi‘iaka, penei: “A ka māhele ho‘i a kekahi po‘e, he ‘ewalu nō Hi‘iaka e like a‘ela nō me ia i hō‘ike ‘ia a‘ela, a eia ko lākou mau inoa: Hi‘iakamākolewāwahiwa‘a a ‘o ka lei hala a me ke ānuenue kona mau hō‘ailona; ... Hi‘iakanoholani, ‘o ka ‘ōnohi ‘ula a me ka uakoko ko ia nei hō‘ailona;...”¹⁰⁹

I ka wā kahiko, ‘o ke ānuenue, he hō‘ailona i ho‘ouna ‘ia aku e kekahi ‘uhane. Malia paha, ‘o ia ‘uhane, he hoa ia, he lālā ‘ohana ‘akahi nō i hala, he ‘aumakua, he akua, a pēlā aku. Maopopo nō nā hō‘ailona ānuenue i kekahi ‘ohana a me kekahi mau kānaka pākahi. Ua ho‘oili ‘ia nā unuhi ‘ohana mai kēlā me kēia hanauna. ‘O ia unuhi ‘ohana, ‘o ia ke kāwili ‘ia o kekahi mo‘olelo/ka‘ao a me kekahi unuhi pono‘ī.¹¹⁰ Eia kahi la‘ana, inā e ‘ō‘ili ana he ānuenue ma mua o kekahi mea e hele aku ana ma luna o ke alahele, he hō‘ailona ia no ke kū a ho‘i ‘ana mai i kahi a ia mea i ho‘omaka aku ai i kāna huaka‘i. ‘O ia ho‘i, aia kekahi mea pō‘ino ma luna o ia alahele. Aia he ‘ōlelo no‘eau e pili ana i ka ‘ō‘ili ‘ana o ke ānuenue ma luna o ke alanui ma ke ‘ano he hō‘ailona pō‘ino: ““Akāhi ka ho‘i ka paoa, ke kau nei ka mākole pua he‘o.”¹¹¹ Ke ‘ō‘ili kekahi ‘ano ānuenue, he hō‘ailona paha ia no ka hala iho ana auane‘i o kekahi kanaka aloha, ka hala ‘ana o kekahi ali‘i a me kona ho‘i ‘ana aku no ka hui pū ‘ana me kona ‘aumakua, a i ‘ole ke ka‘awale ‘ana o kekahi mau mea.

Ua unuhi ‘ia iho ka ‘ō‘ili ‘ana o kekahi ānuenue he hō‘ailona ia no ka make a i ‘ole kekahi pōpilikia, akā, unuhi ‘ia e kekahi po‘e ‘ē a‘e, he hō‘ailona pōmaika‘i.¹¹² Ma ka mana‘o o kekahi mau kāhuna lā‘au lapa‘au, he mea maika‘i a i ‘ole he mea pō‘ino ke ‘ō‘ili ke ānuenue.¹¹³

Ua ha‘i ‘ia he mo‘olelo ānuenue e kekahi kumu, penei: ma ka moku o Keawe, i kekahi manawa o lāua ‘o kona kupunakāne i hele aku ai i ke ko‘a ‘ōpelu, huli a nānā kona kupunakāne i ka pali o Kohala. E pi‘o aku ana kekahi ānuenue ma laila, a pupu‘u ho‘olei loa, pā ka makani hau. ‘O ka ho‘i maila nō ia o lāua i ka hale, no ka mea, he mau hō‘ailona ‘ino ka pi‘o ānuenue a me ka makani hau. ‘O ia ho‘i, he lā ‘ino no ka lawai‘a ‘ana.¹¹⁴

Ua pa‘i ‘ia he ‘atikala nūpepa i kapa ‘ia “Moolelo no ko Hawaii Oihana Kahuna KAPAIA KA OIHANA HOOMANA NO KA I‘A KU.”¹¹⁵ ‘O nā mana‘o nui, ‘o ka ‘oihana kahuna. ‘O ia ho‘i ke kahuna kilokilo, ke kahuna hāhā pā‘ao‘ao, a me ke kahuna ho‘ounauna. ‘O ia mau ‘oihana kahuna, ‘o ia nā mea nāna i unuhi i nā hō‘ailona o ka i‘a kū, ka mahina pouli, ka lā pouli, ka hōkū, ka luakālai, ka hekili, ka pūnolu, ka ‘ōnohi, a me ka uakoko. Ho‘opuka ‘ia ma loko o ia ‘atikala, ‘o ka hō‘ailona o ka luakālai, he ali‘i make ka hopena. ‘O ka pūnolu, inā e kū ka pūnolu i ka moana a i ka ‘āina paha, he ali‘i nui ia. ‘O ka ‘ōnohi, he hō‘ailona ali‘i. ‘O ka uakoko, he hō‘ailona no ka hānau ‘ia ‘ana o kekahi ali‘i, ka hiki ‘ana mai a kekahi ali‘i, a i ‘ole ka hala ‘ana iho o kekahi ali‘i. Na nā kāhuna i unuhi i nā hō‘ailona o ka lewa no nā ali‘i. He kūmole waiwai kēia ‘atikala no ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i ke kuana‘ike o ke kahuna a me ko lākou mana‘o e pili ana i ka ‘ō‘ili ‘ana o ia mau ‘ano ānuenue.

‘Oko‘a paha nā ānuenue e pi‘o a‘e ana mai ka hikina a i ke komohana, ‘oko‘a paha nā ānuenue e pi‘o a‘e ana mai ka ‘ākau a i ka hema. Ua ‘ōlelo ‘ia e kekahī kumu, ‘o nā ānuenue e pi‘o a‘e ana mai ka ‘ākau a i ka hema, la‘a lākou, a ‘o nā ānuenue e pi‘o a‘e ana mai ka hikina a i ke komohana, la‘a ‘ole.¹¹⁶ Eia kekahī mo‘olelo e pili ana i ka pi‘o ‘ana o kekahī ānuenue la‘a. I ia manawa nō, e pi‘o a‘e ana kekahī ānuenue pālua la‘a nona ka waiho‘olu‘u māku‘u (i.l. waioleka) mai Haleakalā a hiki i Maunakea.¹¹⁷

5.4 No Nā Hui Hō‘ailona

Lehulehu nō nā hō‘ailona, a me nā ‘ōuli o nā ‘ano ānuenue a pau ma loko o nā mo‘olelo/ka‘ao Hawai‘i ku‘una, a ma loko o kekahī mau kūmole ‘ē a‘e. Eia na‘e, ma muli o ka heluhelu a kālailai ‘ana i ia mau kūmole, ua ‘ōkomo ‘ia kekahī mau hō‘ailona hou i loko o ia papa helu. ‘O ka hopena, aia he iwakāluakumamākahī hō‘ailona ma loko o ia papa helu¹¹⁸ Hō‘ike ‘ia ma loko o ka Pakuhi 15. I ke kolamu ‘ākau o ia Pakuhi, hō‘ike ‘ia nā kūmole o kēlā me kēia hō‘ailona. Ke nānā kaulona ‘ia ia mau hō‘ailona, like paha kekahī. No laila, ua ho‘ohui ‘ia nā hō‘ailona like ma loko o ‘elima hui. ‘O ia ho‘i, nā hō‘ailona pili i ka hānau a i ‘ole ka make, pili i ka nohona, pili i kahi wānana, pili i ke kū ‘ana, a pili i kekahī ne‘e ‘ana.











He hō‘ailona ānuenue paha ia no ke Kalikiano. Wahi a Nawahi, “O ka wehewehe ana aku i na kumu oiaio maoli a me ka hoakaka ana aku, i na loina maopopo loa e pili ana i ke anuenue a ko ke akua mana i kau aku ai ma ke aouli o ka lani; o ia no kekahi o na kumuaoike maoli i kupono i ka uhane ike a ke akua i haawi mai ai i ke kanaka, i mea e kokua ai i kona hoomaopopo maoli ana aku i ko ke akua mana nui kiekie loa.”¹⁴⁰ He hō‘ailona laulā paha ia, ua loa‘a wale nō kēia hō‘ailona i loko o kā Nawahi. ‘O ia ho‘i, ‘a‘ole loa‘a kēia hō‘ailona ma loko o nā mo‘olelo Hawai‘i ku‘una like ‘ole. He akamai nō ‘o Nawahi i kekahi mau kumuhana Hawai‘i ku‘una like ‘ole, eia na‘e, ho‘ohuli mana‘o nui ‘ia ‘o ia i nā Kalikiano. Hiki ke ‘ike ‘ia ia ho‘ohuli mana‘o ma loko o kekahi mau māhele o kāna kākau ‘ana.

5.5.1.4.4 Ka noho ali‘i a Ioane i ‘ike ai ma Patemosa

Ua ha‘i aku nō ho‘i ‘o Nawahi e pili ana i kēia hō‘ailona ānuenue ma loko o ka puke hope loa o ka Paipala Kalikiano, ‘o ia ho‘i, ka puke ‘o Hoikeana, penei: “Ma ka hoike ana a Ioane, ua ike aku la oia ma ka hihio ma ka mokopuni o Patemosa, he Noho’lii ua puni i ka Pio-anuenue”¹⁴¹. ‘A‘ole nō ho‘i i loa‘a kēia hō‘ailona ma loko o nā mo‘olelo Hawai‘i ku‘una like ‘ole. He hō‘ailona Kalikiano wale nō.

5.5.1.4.5 Ke kuhikuhi ‘ana i ke ala a ke ali‘i

Iā Kū e huli aku ana i kekahi home nona ka hau, ua ‘ike ‘o ia iā Maunakea i ka manawa āna e kū iho ana i ke kuahiwi ‘o Haleakalā. Ua ‘ike ‘o ia i kekahi ānuenue ma ke ‘ano he kuhikuhi ‘ana i kekahi wahi kūpono no kona noho ‘ana. “O keia kuahiwi ana e ike nei oia no ke kuahiwi nani o “Mauna” Kea. A ma ia wa hookahi nohoi ke ike la kona mau maka i ka pio o ke

5.5.1.4.6 Ka hānau ‘ia ‘ana o kekahi mō‘ī, ali‘i ki‘eki‘e, ‘e‘epa

Ua ‘ike pinepine ‘ia ke ānuenue i ka manawa i hānau ‘ia ai kekahi ali‘i. Hiki ke ‘ike maopopo ‘ia kēia i ka manawa i hānau ‘ia ai ‘o Kamehameha V, penei:

“...O ka la hanau o ka Moi, oia kona la i puka mai ai mai ka opu mai o kona makuahine, a ma ia la, ua pouli ka aina, ua noho ino na opua, ua paa ke kumu lani ma kauwahi, a ua kaawale ma kauwahi, ua inoino ka moana, ua hakukoi na ale, ua paio na makani, ua hui na welau o ka honua, ua kapio na anuenue, ua kui ka hekili,.....”¹⁴³

5.5.1.4.7 Ka nohona o kekahi ali‘i, mō‘ī, ‘e‘epa, kupua, akua, ‘uhane

Ma loko o ke ka‘ao o Kahalaopuna, aia kekahi wehewehe ‘ana e pili ana i ke awāwa ‘o Mānoa, ‘o ia ka nohona o Kahalaopuna. ‘O Kauakuahine (ka ua o ke kualapa) ka makuahine a ‘o Kahaukani (ka makani o Mānoa) ka makuakāne o Kahalaopuna: “Ma ka nānā aku nō ho‘i i kēia awāwa, me he mea lā, i loko o nā lā a pau o ka makahiki, e kāhiko mau ‘ia ana kēia awāwa e ke ānuenue, a e kilihune mau ana nō ho‘i ka ua i ka hapanui o ka manawa ma laila.”¹⁴⁴ Ua noho ‘o Kahalaopuna ma loko o kekahi hale kapu i kapa ‘ia ‘o Kahiamano ma laila.

holo ‘ana mai Hawai‘i a i O‘ahu, a i Kaua‘i paha. Wehewehe ‘ia ka hana i ke ahiahi ma mua o ka ha‘alele ‘ana, penei. “...aia ma ke ahiahi ka hapai ana i keia hana. Penei ka hana ana, e mama ka awa, kalua ka puua, a wali ka awa, moa no hoi ka puua, a pau i ka okiokilia a waiho ma na palau i hoohinuhinuia, a ku no hoi na apu awa. A makaukau keia mau mea, alaila, o ka pule no ia o ke kahuna i ke akua o ka poe holo waa, a pau ka pule ana, ai no hoi a pau ka ai ana, nana aku ke kahuna i ke aouli, ina i ku ke anuenue a i pio mamua o ka waa, a o ka punohu paha, alaila, i aku ke kahuna, aole e pono ke holo o make auanei ma ka moana; a ina hoi i nana aku oia i ka opua, aole he ku maikai mai, ua lele ino ke ao, ua moku moku liilii na opua i ka lewa; olelo hou no ke kahuna aole e holo o make no, Aka hoi, ina e nana ke kahuna a i ku ka punohu mahope o ka waa, nee hoi ka ua koko, pio ke anuenue, a maikai hoi ke ku ana mai o na opua, alaila; i aku ke kahuna, ae, ua maikai, aole no he mea nana e keakea mai;...”¹⁴⁵ Hō‘ike ia la‘ana i ka ho‘ohana ‘ia ‘ana o ke ānuenue ma ke ‘ano he ‘ōuli/wānana.

5.5.1.4.9 Ke kō ‘ana o kekahi wānana

Ma loko o ke ka‘ao o Lā‘ieikawai, lehulehu nō nā hō‘ailona o ka ho‘okō ‘ia ‘ana o kekahi wānana. ‘O ka pi‘o ānuenue a me ka pūnihu nō ho‘i kekahi hō‘ailona, penei: “Ho‘okahi anahulu ma hope iho o ko Kahalaomāpuana ho‘i ‘ana mai mai Ke‘alohilani mai, i ia manawa, hiki maila ka hō‘ailona mua a ko lākou kaikunāne e like me ke kauoha i kona kaikuahine. Pēlā i ho‘ā‘o li‘ili‘i ai nā hō‘ailona i loko o nā lā ‘elima, a ‘o ke ono o ka lā, ku‘i ka hekili, ua ka ua, kaiko‘o ka moana, waikahe ka ‘āina, ‘ōlapa ka uila, uhi ka noe, pi‘o ke ānuenue, kū ka pūnihu i ka moana. I ia manawa, ‘ōlelo aku ka makāula, “E a‘u mau kaikamāhine, ua hiki mai ka ho‘okō ‘ia ‘ana o ku‘u wānana e like me ka‘u ‘ōlelo mua iā ‘oukou.””¹⁴⁶

5.5.1.4.10 He ala ānuenue i ka mahina, lewa, pali, ola ma hope

He mo‘olelo i ha‘i ‘ia e kekahi mea i kelepona mai i ka papahana lekiō ‘o Ka Leo Hawai‘i i ka makahiki 1974. Ua ha‘i ‘ia kēia mo‘olelo iā ia e kona makuahine e pili ana i ka ho‘olewa o kona kupunakāne (‘o ia ho‘i ko ka mea kelepona kupunakāne kuakahī). He kanaka ‘ano nui ke kupunakāne kuakahī. Ko‘iko‘i nō ‘o ia i kona mau lā. Ma hope o kona hala ‘ana iho, wahī ‘ia ke kupapa‘u a pa‘a, a ho‘omoe ‘ia i loko o kona wa‘a. ‘Auamo ‘ia a hiki i kekahi ana i uka o ke kuahiwi (ma ka mokupuni ‘o Hawai‘i) a kanu ‘ia ma loko o ia ana. Lawelawe ‘ia ka ho‘olewa a ma hope, ho‘omaka ka ‘ohana e ho‘i ma lalo iho. ‘Oiai lākou e hele wāwae ana, ho‘omaka ka ua i mua o lākou, ‘o ia ho‘i ka ua koko, ka heka waikoko. Ua huli kekahi po‘e e nānā ma hope a ‘ike ‘ia ia wa‘a e lewa a‘e ana i ka lewa, a hāpai ‘ia ka mana o ke kupunakāne kuakahī. Ua hāpai ‘ia kēlā wa‘a a luna pono o ka lua pele ‘o Halema‘uma‘u. Ma luna o kekahi ānuenue i lawe ‘ia ai kēlā wa‘a. Pi‘o ke ānuenue mai ke ana a hiki i ka lua pele. Ua ho‘oiho ‘ia ia wa‘a a komo i loko o ka lua pele. No ka ‘ohana Pele ke kupunakāne kuakahī a ua ‘ōlelo ‘ia aku e ka po‘e, e ho‘iho‘i ‘ia ana ‘o ia i kona wahi pono.¹⁴⁷

Ma loko o kēia māhele e pili ana i ka pi‘o ānuenue piha, hiki ke ‘ike ‘ia, ‘oko‘a ke kuana‘ike Hawai‘i, ‘oko‘a ke kuana‘ike ‘epukema.

Pili ia pi‘o me ka ua lanipili. I kekahi mau manawa, pilipili kekahi Pi‘o Pēpē i ka pi‘o wahine, ‘a‘ole he pi‘o ka‘awale, he ‘auina kala ia. Ma loko o nā Pi‘o Pēpē, aia nā waiho‘olu‘u ‘ōma‘oma‘o, waioleka, a me ka lenalena maoli. Pili nā Pi‘o Pēpē me ka ua kilihune.¹⁵¹ E nānā ‘ia ka māhele 5.5.3.1 ma lalo iho no kekahi ho‘ākāka ‘ana e pili ana i ka pi‘o pēpē.



Eia kahi la‘ana maika‘i o nā ‘ōlelo ho‘ohālike ānuenue ma loko o ka mo‘olelo o Hainakolo, ‘o ia ho‘i, ma loko o kekahi oli (hō‘ike ‘ia i ka hua‘ōlelo kā‘ele). Iā Kuaikauakama i komo iho ai i loko o ka hale, pule ‘o ia i kahi pule inoa no Hina. Ma hope o kēlā, ua kau a‘ela ‘o Hina i kēia pule i kona kaikunāne haku, ‘o ia ho‘i, ‘o Kuaikauakama.

5.6.2 Ka hehi o ke kapua‘i akua

hehi o ke kapuai akua (anuenue) maluna pono o ke kaiaulu hikina o na pali o Hamakua, a lele e wale ae la no ko'u hauli no ka mea nona ia hoailona kapu alii mai ka po mai.”²¹⁰

5.6.3 Ka pi‘o lani, pi‘o akua

Ma loko o ka mo‘olelo o Hi‘iakaikapoliopele, i kekahi kau a Hi‘iaka, ua kāhea ‘o ia no ka ho‘i ‘ana mai o Pele i ka lua. He kau loloa nō ia, a no laila, hō‘ike ‘ia he ‘āpana iki o nā lālani a pau ma lalo iho nei:

5.6.4 Ka haka ‘ula a Kāne

He ‘ōlelo no‘eau kā ka puke a Pukui, penei: “Haka ‘ula a Kāne.”²¹² He ānuenue ia i ‘ane piha kona kohu i ka waiho‘olu‘u ‘ula‘ula pua rose. He ‘ōlelo ho‘ohālike nō ho‘i ia no ka hikina.²¹³

Ua ho‘opuka ‘ia ia ‘ōlelo ho‘ohālike ma loko o ke oli ‘o He Mele Inoa No Aikanaka na Keaulumoku. He oli loloa nō ia, a no laila, hō‘ike ‘ia he ‘āpana iki o nā lālani ma lalo iho nei:

“....Ua hana i ka hui ula a ke koli

Aia i ka haka ula a Kane

5.6.5 Ka wāwae, kapua‘i o ke akua

Ma loko o ka mo‘olelo o Hainakolo, ua ho‘omaopoo ‘o Mooinanea i ke ‘ano o kona hoa paio, ‘o ia ho‘i, he akua ka pua‘a āna e hakakā ana. He kino lau ka pua‘a no Kuaikauakama. “Eia ke kapuai ame ka wawae o ke akua ke ku mai nei iluna o ka puua.”²¹⁵

Like kekahi ‘ōlelo no‘eau ‘ē a‘e me kēia ‘ōlelo ho‘ohālike, ‘o ia ho‘i, “He ‘ehu wāwae no kalani.” He ‘ōlelo ho‘ohālike no ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana o nā akua i kekahi ali‘i i ka manawa e huaka‘i ana i kekahi ‘āina ‘ē.²¹⁶

5.6.6 Ke ala ko‘i‘ula (ala muku) a Kāne, Kanaloa

Ma loko o ka mo‘olelo o Hi‘iakaikapoliopele, ma hope o ko Hi‘iaka ho‘omake ‘ana iā Kamō‘ili‘ili (ka mo‘o ‘e‘epa), ua ‘ōlelo ‘o Lohi‘au penei: ““O ke ‘ano anoano like iholo nō ho‘i ia me nā wāhine o ka ‘āina ‘o Hā‘ena i ho‘ohihi ai iā ‘oe a‘e a lilo ‘oe i ke ala ko‘i‘ula a Kanaloa...”²¹⁷

Ua wehewehe ‘ia penei: “Ae; ke ike la olua i ke anuenue e moe ana mai luna mai o ka pali a hawele ilalo ma ka punawai kapu o ka hanai a kakou: nolaila, he wawae ia no ke akua o ke ala muku ia a Kane.”²¹⁸



5.12.2.2 Nā pō‘ai lewa o ka punakea e ‘ō‘ili ai



5.13 Kekahi Mau Ānuenue Kupaianaha

Nui ‘ino nā la‘ana o ka ‘ō‘ili ‘ana o ke ānuenue i nā manawa e kū‘ē ana i ka mana‘o o nā‘epekema komohana. E hō‘ike ‘ia ana ‘elua la‘ana mai ka mo‘olelo o Hainakolo, a ho‘okahi la‘ana mai ka mo‘olelo o Keaomelemele ma lalo iho nei.

Iā Kuaikauakama e kū a‘e ana i ka wēkiu o Maunakea, me ka nānā ‘ana aku iā luna pono o ke awāwa ‘o Waipio, ua ‘ike ‘o ia i ke ānuenue like āna i ‘ike mua ai i luna o Haleakalā, ‘oiai ‘o ia ma Maui, penei: “..., ia wa oia i ike mai ai i ke anuenue ana i ike mua ai iluna o ka piko o Haleakala, oiai oia ma Maui. A i kona ike ana’ku i ua anuenue nei, olelo iho la oia iaia iho, “o ke Ku-lua iho la ka keia o ka‘u ike ana i keia anuenue. Aohe ua o kela wahi a‘u e ike aku nei, aka, aia nae ke anuenue ke pio mai la. Owai la hoi ke alii nui nona keia hoailona lei ula e ku mai la? He kane paha oe: he wahine paha oe?....”³⁴⁹ He mea kupaianaha ia, no ka mea i ke kuana‘ike ‘epekema komohana, aia ka pono ‘o ke kau ‘ana o kauwahi huna wai i ka lewa i mea no ke ānuenue e ‘ō‘ili ai.

‘O kēia la‘ana, like ia me ka la‘ana i hō‘ike ‘ia ma loko o ka māhele 5.6.1 o luna a‘e. I kekahi manawa, e nīnau aku ana ‘o Aniani (he kahuna) i kekahi kahoaka ma o kahi pule. E pule ana aku ‘o ua Aniani i loko o kahi hale, a i lawa nō a pau ka pule ‘ana: “...o ka wa no ia i ku‘i iho ai ka hekili, olapa ana ka uwila. A ma ia wa i pi‘o iho ai kekahi anuenue maluna pono o ka apu awa e hamama ana; a ike aku la keia i ke ku ana mai o kekahi kanaka ui i hele a ohuohu ke poo i ka lehua”³⁵⁰ ‘O ka mea kupaianaha, ‘o ia ka ‘ō‘ili ‘ana o ia ānuenue ma luna o ka ‘apu ‘awa ma loko o ka hale. ‘A‘ole ‘o Aniani i ‘ike i kahi o ia kahoaka e kū ana. No laila, pule hou ‘o ia me ke noi ana i ia ‘ike. A ma hope o ka pau ‘ana o ia pule, penei ka hua: “Pau ka pule a ua Kahuna nei, ike aku la oia ma ke kahoaka i ke ku ana ae o kekahi anuenue a puka mawaho o kaupoku o ko ia

I nana ae ko ia nei hana i kaupoku o ka hale, e pio ana ke anuenue i kai o ka moana; a ma ia wa hookahi no ike aku la oia i ke ku mai a ka onohi ula i kai lilo o ka moana kaiuli. Ma muli o keia mau hoike a ke anuenue, ho‘omaopopo iho la keia, no ke kai lilo loa mai ke kanaka nona ke kahoaka ana e ike nei. Aole ia he kanaka no Hawaii nei. Mamuli o keia hoike kamahao a ka apu awa, hoomaopopo iho la ia, he akua ke kanaka nona ke kahoaka ana i ike ai.”³⁵¹ Ma muli o ia mau mea, ho‘omaopopo ‘o Aniani, he akua, a he kupua ia kahoaka, mai Kahiki mai. Kupaianaha nō ka hana a ia ānuenue.

Ma loko o ka mo‘olelo o Keaomelemele.“...oiai o Hina e hoomaemae ana ia ia iho, huli maila kona alo i waho o ka puka o ko laua hale, a ike maila i ka punohu ula e halii pono ana ma ka puka o ka hale. Pane ae la oia ia Ku, “He mea kupanaha, aole hoi he ua o waho e ku nei ka punohu, no laila, e puka aku oe e nana i ka hana a ka punohu no keia wa.” Ae maila o Ku i ka olelo a kana wahine; ia Ku nae i puka aku ai i waho a huli ae la oia a nana, a ike ae la oia e pipio pono ana nā anuenue ehiku i ka wa hookahi i loko o ka lewa me ke kau wahi ao ua ole.”³⁵² He mau mea kupaihanaha maoli ma loko o ia puana‘ī. Ma ke kuana‘ike ‘epukema, ‘a‘ole hiki ke ‘ike ‘ia nā ānuenue ‘ehiku i ka wā ho‘okahi, no ka mea, poahi loa nō nā ānuenue kūlana ki‘eki‘e.
